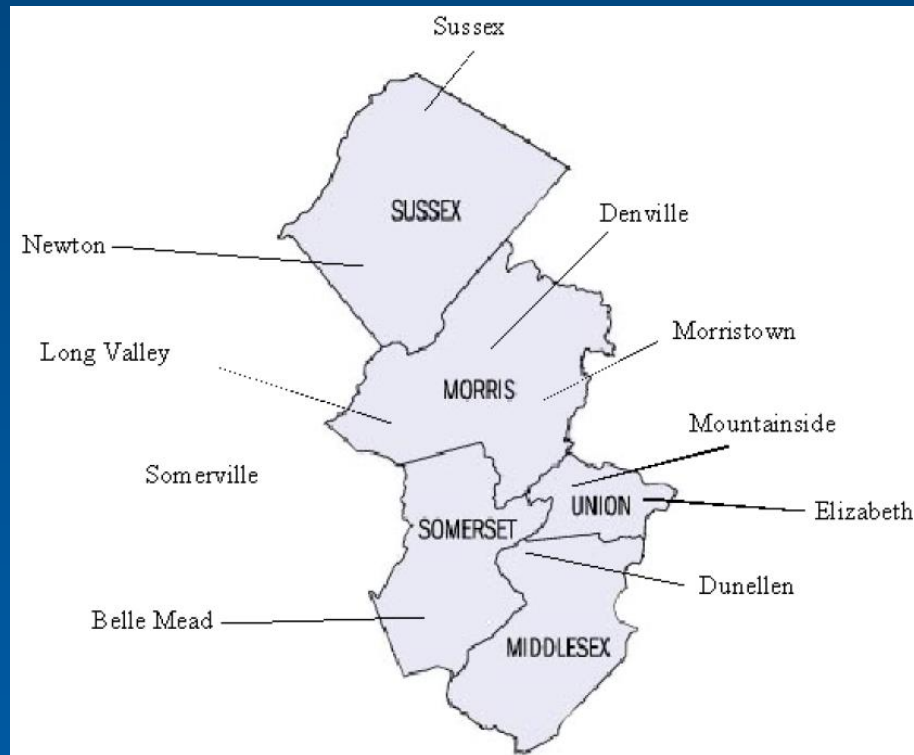

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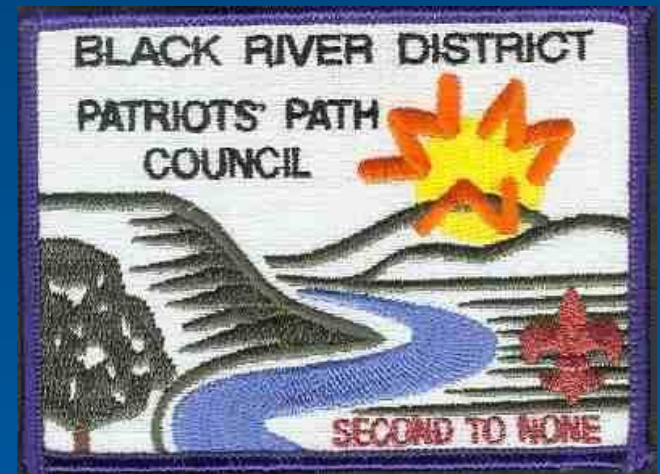




Black River District

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Black River District

- **Promotional materials available include flyers, yard signs, posters, cub opportunity cards, and banners.**
- **All packs were provided the new manual “Recruiting Ideas for Cub Scout Leaders”**
- **Several training classes were offered to district Packs on the Recruitment Manual.**
- **District Exec offered support in all Black River recruitment efforts, and was available for questions and to offer creative options for consideration in the recruitment process.**
- **Information was gathered on the dates and locations of each pack’s various recruitment events.**

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Black River District

- We place importance on finding out the pack volunteer responsible for recruitment.
- In preparation for SWFS, a call was placed to each Cubmaster or Committee Chair to ascertain the pack volunteer responsible for recruitment.
- A discussion was then held between the Pack's recruitment chair and the District's SWFS Champion on the recruitment events held, their success, and on alternate approaches available to increase participation.
- This dialogue offered a sounding board or interactive resource to the Pack recruiter.

Our District provided in person recruiting support to bolster smaller units and provide experienced leaders capable of driving the Scouting message.

We gave several boy talks through different public, parochial and private schools and offered to run some matchbox-car races.

After a reality check, the BSA National Gap Analysis yielded three critical areas in Munsee District without a Scouting presence.

The first of these areas is Linden, NJ. We attended a youth event sponsored by the township where we initiated recruitment of several interested adults and families.

One of our unit leaders helped construct a parade float with which we can enter the township parade in 2014.

The second of these exposed areas was shown to be Elizabeth, NJ – where we do have a strong Scouting presence. Our efforts were to support these existing units and add to their numbers.

With the support of our Unit Commissioners we were able to expand our Scoutreach in this area.

The last of these exposed areas had no Scouting presence whatsoever. In fact, there were a few units that had died over the course of several years for various reasons. The township seemed disinterested in keeping Scouting alive within their community.

With the support of a recently retired-from-Scouting Scouter and parents absorbed through hands-on recruitment efforts, we started a new Pack with nine boys that is growing organically, is aligned with a public school, the Lions club and the Fire Department.
